


Quad Bike Crush Protections Devices (CPDs)

In May 2019 Worksafe NZ published a policy clarification "strongly recommending" the installation of crush protection devices (CPDs) on quad bikes. A paper was presented to Exec on 9 September and the 5 recommendations were approved. This includes the installation of CPDs on all quad bike before the end of 2019 (unless a risk assessment carried out for specific tasks or areas of operation indicates an increase in risk rather than a decrease.)
