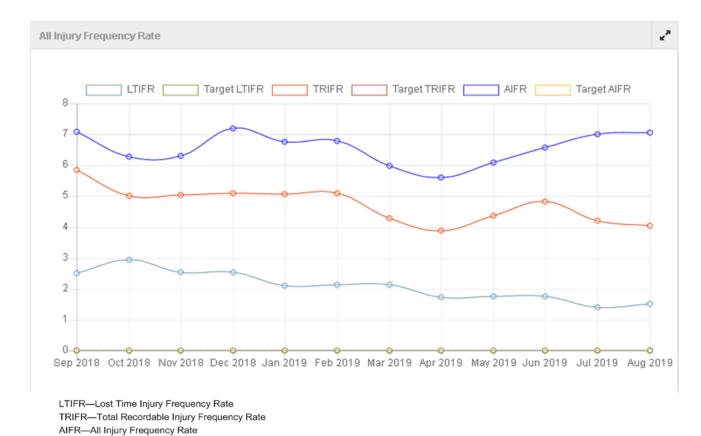

5. Quick Updates

Quad Bike Crush Protections Devices (CPDs)

WorkSafe NZ have released a policy clarification "strongly recommending" the installation of Crush Protection Devices (CPDs) on River Management Group have implemented a new procurement process to form a 'panel' of approved suppliers of quad bikes. Quad bike manufacturers have always been against them and a significant debate has occurred on both sides of the plant and equipment. Health and safety prequalification is part of this process and the Senior Health and Safety Advisor Tasman for years. There appears to be far more evidence and a much greater voice for CPDs than against. Most research is working with River Management to ensure consistency across Horizons. recognises that there is likely to be a net safety gain associated with their installation. A paper is being prepared for the Exec meeting on 26 August.

Vault Roll-out

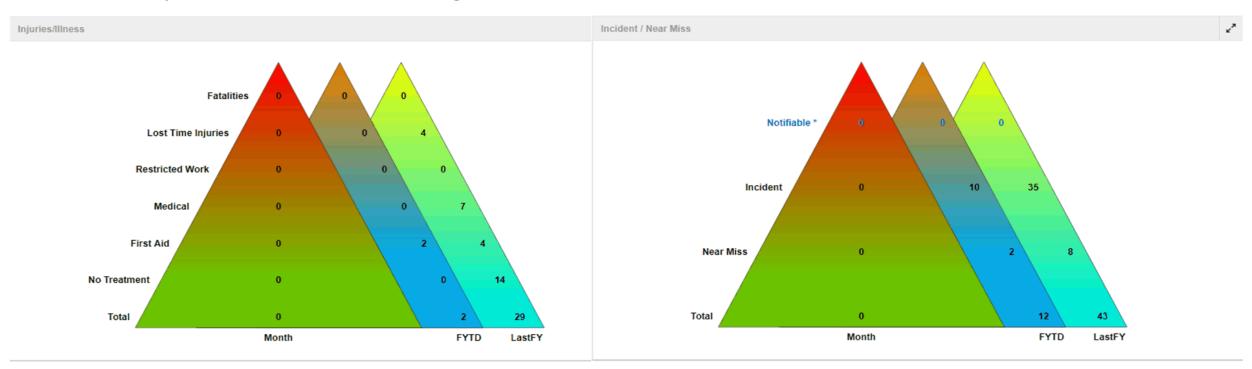
Vault roll-out is continuing with training for NRP Group managers and coordinators on 12 September with further sessions scheduled on 18 and 25 September for River Management Group and others.
