Community Funding Support for Road Safety

Are you involved in road safety initiatives in your local area?

We have funding available for community groups in the Horizons Region to run road safety education activities.

Why do we do this?

Improving the safety on our roads is of critical importance for this region. Road crashes cause avoidable deaths and serious injuries in our Region with the estimated social costs of these crashes running into the hundreds of millions per year. The impacts on the victims, whānau, friends, communities and workplaces are immeasurable.

The key issues causing crashes include intersection driver behaviour, speed and driving while impaired, fatigued or distracted. Young drivers and drivers who are not fully licensed are over represented in crash statistics. Pedestrians, cyclists and other vulnerable road users are also involved in crashes too often. The low use of seat belts and child restraints in some communities is a concern.

In addition to employing road safety coordinators to undertake road safety education, we recognise that community groups can make a difference in road safety due to their knowledge of and connections to their communities.

For example, driver licensing programmes are funded where community organisations help people with literacy or language problems to gain their driver's licence.

What type of activities may be funded?

The fund is aimed at addressing road safety issues in our local community. Examples of programmes to be funded include driver education and licensing, restraint checking clinics and cyclist education.

Your proposed activity must be consistent with the *Road to Zero:* New Zealand's Road Safety Strategy 2020-2030,

Areas of focus in Road to Zero are:

- Speed management
- Vehicle safety
- Work-related road safety
- Road user choices
- System management

Funding cannot be used for road engineering, including signage and markings, acquiring vehicles, or acquiring large capital items such as computers or office furniture.

This funding is contestable and applications will be evaluated to determine how well they will address the region's identified road safety issues.

Applications close on Friday 27 March 2020 at 5pm.

You will need to contribute 36 per cent of the cost of your project from your community organisation or from other funding.

Please note: 'In kind' donations cannot be accepted as part of your organisation's contribution. An 'in kind' contribution is a non-cash cost which is given a cash value. An example of this is a school loaning classroom space to run a programme and attributing a value to this.
