1. KARAKIA AND WELCOME

5. CONFIRMATION OF MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING AND MATTERS ARISING

<u>RESOLVED</u> that the minutes of the Monday 25th March 2024 meeting be confirmed as a true and accurate record of the meeting.

Oriana Paewai advised that Ngāti Kauwhata will be sending someone to replace Dennis Emery.

The group discussed whether the Governance Group is an appropriate size, and whether the quorum required as stated in the Terms of Reference is appropriate. It was decided that the quorum requirements should remain unchanged at a minimum of one more member than half of the Governance Group, so as to be representative.

<u>RESOLVED</u> that the Terms of Reference be updated, to note that the Governance Group shall still meet if the quorum requirements are not met, but any significant decisions will require a quorum to be valid.

6. WORK PROGRAMME UPDATE (Logan Brown)

· Lower Manawatū Natural Character Index;

Logan Brown provided an example of a Natural Character Index (NCI) report (the NCI ratio for a river quantifies channel confinement and a range of other river characteristics over time). When this report becomes available, it will be circulated to the group.

Dr Russell Death is being contracted to create a similar report, including Habitat Quality Index (HQI). The HQI will look at 10 sections of the Öroua River and 10 sections of the Pohangina River as part of this project. The NCI report will look at historic aerial photographs to quantify changes to the river channel over time; these historic channel lines will be added to a publicly available online map.

Danielle Harris raised that the current work stream is approached solely through Western science, and there is a need to embed Mātauranga Māori now.

Action: Logan Brown will contact iwi by the 15th of August 2024, to discuss the overlay of Te Ao Māori.

7. COMMUNICATION & RELATIONSHIPS (Logan Brown)

Website:

Oriana Paewai has been in touch with Ruby Stevens regarding incorporating Mātauranga Māori into the project webpage. It was recommended that the webpage include further clarification around gravel extraction regulations, as well as access to iwi and hapū management plans. Phil Teal requested that the group be notified when changes are made to the webpage.

Public Consultation;

The need for consultation with the wider community was discussed. It was noted that this should include recreational/historical/cultural users of the rivers as well as landowners. Logan Brown requested that the Governance Group provide guidance to the Project Team as to how best communicate to communities.

Recommendations included using the mailing lists for the Manawatū River Users Group/Leaders' Accord and catchment groups, as well as the Tōtara Reserve project, to reach the wider community.

It was decided that Logan Brown will attend the Pohangina-Öroua Scheme Meeting on 16th August 2024 in Cheltenham, and present a short overview of the project (including an example from the Manawatū River NCI report of channel changes over time, and a link to the NBS website). The Project Team will contact the Horizons Communications Team regarding creating video content for the project – Te Kenehi Teira nominated Alan Taylor for this.

Mātauranga Māori;

It was decided that Jon Proctor/Hone Morris will present the Mātauranga Māori Framework created for the Manawatū River Leaders' Accord to the group, to show how it could be applied to this project. Te Kenehi Teira and Utiku Potaka may also present. Oriana Paewai and Ruby Stevens will work together to ensure everyone is aware of this and has opportunity to contribute.
