Currently all accord streams are fenced and some planted. We are going through the process of planting more. We've planted 1,250 trees in the last 18 months, with 500 more on order from Horizons for winter 2020 and also growing another 500 ourselves.

We also have 'Herd Homes' so we can safely and humanely ~~star~~ house and feed cows in our wettest months, this results in effluent being stored in concrete bunkers during the winter when leaching is at its worst & we can spread on paddocks during the summer when it won't run into the creeks.
