The Horowhenua District Council supports in part the submission of Kahungunu Ki Tamaki Nui-a-Rua Trust, in particular that part of their submissions which seeks greater consideration for the cumulative effects of multiple land use activities within subcatchments and water management zones, with the ultimate aim of reducing nutrients in catchments where water quality is degraded, and managing nutrients within catchment loads. The Council submits that, to enable this outcome to be achieved in the target catchments in the Horowhenua District, that Plan Change 2 needs to be withdrawn and transitioned to a collaborative planning process, as provided in Schedule 1 to the Resource Management Act 1991 (RMA). In the absence

of a robust catchment-wide approach to nutrient management and transition planning in the Horowhenua target catchments, and buy-in from landowners and key stakeholders, PC2 will not achieve the objectives of integrated resource management and fulfil the principles and purposes of the RMA. A collaborative planning approach with all stakeholders would be a better alternative, and most likely to deliver a long lasting, enduring transition plan for intensive land use activities in the target catchments.
